TRABZON UNIVERSITY GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION OF INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS TO ASSOCIATE DEGREE AND BACHELOR'S DEGREE PROGRAMS

CHAPTER ONE

Purpose and Scope, Basis and Definitions

Purpose

Article 1 - (1) The purpose of this Directive is to regulate the principles regarding the admission of students from abroad to Trabzon University at the associate degree and undergraduate levels.

Scope

Article 2 - (1) This Directive covers the application requirements, quotas, examinations, evaluation and registration principles for the admission of students from abroad to Trabzon University, excluding those accepted through bilateral agreements and those accepted as scholarship recipients of the Government of the Republic of Turkey.

Basis

Article 3 - (1) This directive has been prepared taking into account Articles 6 and 7 of the Higher Education Law No. 2547 and the Principles and amendments regarding the Admission of Students from Abroad, which were adopted at the meeting of the General Assembly of Higher Education on 21/1/2010 and amended at the meeting of the General Assembly of Higher Education on 13/02/2013.

Definitions

Article 4 - (1) In this Directive;

- a) Candidate: A student who wishes to study at Trabzon University at the associate/bachelor's degree level from abroad or to take the Foreign National Student Selection Examination,
- b) Unit: The faculties, colleges, conservatories, and vocational schools within Trabzon University,
- c) Unit Management Board: The management board of the faculties, colleges, conservatories, and vocational schools within Trabzon University that accept students from abroad,
- ç) TRNC: The Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus,
- d) Student Affairs Department: Trabzon University Student Affairs Department,
- e) Rectorate: Trabzon University Rectorate,
- f) Senate: Trabzon University Senate,
- g) TR-YÖS: Turkey Foreign Student Admission Examination
- h) (Repealed; Directive that came into force with Senate Decision No. 76 dated 12/6/2024)
- i) University: Trabzon University,
- i) Management Board: Trabzon University Management Board,

j) YÖK: Refers to the Council of Higher Education,

k) (Annex; Directive that entered into force with the Senate Decision No. 76 dated 12/6/2024)

ÖSYM: Refers to the Measurement, Selection and Placement Center.

PART TWO

Quota, Application, Admission and Registration Requirements

Quotas

Article 5 - (1) Students from abroad are admitted to the associate and undergraduate level programs of the faculties, colleges, conservatories, and vocational schools affiliated with Trabzon University, with the approval of the Council of Higher Education. (2) The quotas decided by the University Senate upon the proposal of the boards of faculties, colleges, conservatories, or vocational schools wishing to admit foreign students are submitted to the approval of the Council of Higher Education. The Council of Higher Education regulates the quotas for students to be admitted from abroad for associate and undergraduate level programs in relation to the YKS Higher Education Programs and Quotas Guide, and the quotas approved by the Council are announced. (3) The University is free to fill or not fill the announced quotas. If there are no applications for the announced quotas or if the quota is not filled, the University Board of Directors decides to add the unfilled or unapplied quotas (excluding the fields of Teaching and Law) to the quotas of other programs.

Candidates Eligible to Apply

Article 6 - (1) Candidates must be in their final year of high school or equivalent, or have graduated; a) Foreign nationals;

b) Those who are Turkish citizens by birth but have obtained permission from the Ministry of Interior to renounce their Turkish citizenship, and their minor children registered in their renunciation of Turkish citizenship certificates who document that they possess a Certificate of Use of Recognized Rights in accordance with the Turkish Citizenship Law, (Article 7 of the Turkish Citizenship Law No. 5901 states that "A child born within or outside Turkey to a Turkish citizen mother or father within a marriage is a Turkish citizen." It is advisable for candidates applying to the quotas for admission from abroad to review the Turkish Citizenship Law.)

c) Those who were foreign nationals and later acquired Turkish citizenship or those with dual citizenship in this situation.

ç) (1) Among the Turkish citizens who continued their secondary education abroad before 01/02/2013, those who completed the last three years of their secondary education (high school) in a foreign country other than the TRNC [those who completed all of their secondary education (high school) in Turkish schools opened under the Ministry of National Education in a foreign country other than the TRNC] (2) Candidates who started secondary education abroad after 01/02/2013 and who completed their entire secondary education (high school) in a foreign country other than the TRNC [including those who completed their entire secondary education (high school) in Turkish schools opened under the Ministry of National Education in a foreign country other than the TRNC],

d) Those who are citizens of the TRNC, reside in the TRNC and have completed their secondary education (high school) in the TRNC and have GCEAL exam results, and those who registered

and received education in colleges and high schools in other countries between 2005-2010 and have or will have GCEAL exam results, their applications will be accepted.

Candidates Not Eligible to Apply

Article 7 – (1) Candidates who are:

- a) Turkish citizens who have completed all of their secondary education (high school) in Turkey or the TRNC,
- b) TRNC citizens (excluding those who have completed all of their secondary education (high school) in TRNC high schools and have GCE AL results, and those who registered and received education in colleges and high schools in other countries between 2005-2010 and have or will have GCE AL exam results),
- c) Dual citizens whose first nationality by birth is Turkish, as defined in subparagraph (b) of paragraph 1 of Article 6, (excluding those who meet the conditions in subparagraph (ç) of paragraph 1 of Article 6),
- ç) One of whose nationalities is TRNC Applications from dual nationals (excluding those who completed their entire secondary education (high school) in TRNC high schools and have GCE AL results, and those who enrolled and received education in colleges and high schools in other countries between 2005-2010 and have or will have GCE AL exam results),
- d) Turkish citizens who received their education in schools within embassies in Turkey or in foreign high schools in Turkey, or those who fall under the scope of the first paragraph of Article 6,
- e) TRNC citizens and those who have renounced Turkish citizenship/Blue Card holders and foreign nationals who will enroll in secondary education institutions in Turkey from the 2022-2023 academic year onwards,

(excluding embassy schools and international private educational institutions listed in the MOBIS system, and foreign nationals brought to our country within the framework of the project carried out by the Ministry of National Education) will not be accepted.

Admission Requirements

Article 8 - (1) In order for the applications of the candidates to be accepted, they must have at least one of the following conditions and pass the threshold score set for these conditions (Appendix Table 1);

- a) (Repealed; Directive that entered into force with the Senate Decision No. 76 dated 12/6/2024)
- b) Having a sufficient score from one of the equivalent exams with international and national validity in the status of high school graduation and/or university entrance exams,
- c) Having a secondary education graduation score in their own system. (2) For the candidates who will apply, there is no limitation on the validity period of the equivalent exams in the status of high school graduation exams (Abitur, International Baccalaureate, GCE, Tawjihi etc.) approved by the Council of Higher Education. However, the validity period of the exams that are in the status of university entrance exams (SAT, ACT, GAOKO, YÖS etc.) is two years.

Application Process

Article 9 - (1) Application, registration and admission procedures for foreign students are carried out by the Student Affairs Office between the dates specified by the University. (2) The necessary documents for application, any special conditions and explanations are announced on the University's website. Candidates must submit their applications completely and in accordance with the application method specified in the announcement, along with the documents specified in the announcement. (3) Candidates must also submit a document detailing the minimum and maximum scores and success criteria of the exam score type they used in their application. (4) Applications not submitted within the application period or submitted with incomplete/incorrect documents will be considered invalid. (5) Candidates whose applications are accepted are obliged to provide the originals of the documents they submitted during the application process, if requested.

Foreign National Student Admissions Commission (YUÖKK)

Article 10 - (1) The evaluation of candidates applying to the foreign national student quota, placement in programs, and evaluation of appeals are carried out by the YUÖKK. The Student Affairs Department carries out the secretariat duties related to the work of the YUÖKK. (2) The YUÖKK consists of four main and four alternate academic and administrative personnel appointed by the Rector, under the chairmanship of the Vice Rector responsible for the University Student Affairs Department. The commission serves for a period of 3 years. A new appointment is made in the same manner to complete the remaining term in place of the departing commission member.

Evaluation, Placement and Registration Principles

Article 11 - (1) Applications of candidates who do not meet the application requirements will not be considered. (2) Evaluation and placement procedures regarding applications are carried out by the Commission (Foreign National Student Admission Commission (YUÖKK)) established by the Rector. (3) Candidates can make a maximum of five choices from the announced quotas, indicating their ranking and the number of choices they are eligible to apply for. (4) The Commission calculates the placement score by converting the scores of the exams listed in Annex Table 1 to a 100-point system. Placement scores are ranked from highest to lowest. In case of a tie in placement scores, the candidate with the most recent high school graduation date is considered first, and if there is still a tie, the younger candidate is considered. (5) (Amended; Directive entered into force with Senate Decision No. 76 dated 12/6/2024) In the placement process, students from abroad are primarily accepted based on the TR-YÖS results applied by ÖSYM from 2023 onwards. (6) (Amended; Directive entered into force with Senate Decision No. 76 dated 12/6/2024) If there are vacancies in the quota as a result of the placement made primarily with the TR-YÖS score, the evaluation of the candidates is done with the standard scores they have received from one of the equivalent exams (ABITUR, TQDK, SAT, ACT, GAOKAO, GCE AL, etc.) that have national and international validity in other countries and are equivalent to high school graduation and/or university entrance exams, or with scores converted to a hundred-point (100-point) system according to the equivalent exam score, and the candidates are placed in only one program as main and reserve candidates according to their order of preference within the quota. (7) (Repealed; Directive that entered into force with Senate Decision No. 76 dated 12/6/2024)

(8) In case of a quota deficit, placement is made by taking into account the secondary education (high school) graduation score of the candidates. (9) The number of candidates of the same country accepted to a program cannot exceed 20% of the existing quota of that program. If there

are no applications for the quota allocated to the country/countries or if the quota is not filled, the country threshold is not applied, the unfilled and/or unapplied quotas can be transferred to the other country quota or the country/countries quota can be abolished and the placement process can be done accordingly. (10) In the evaluation phase of applications for the quotas for admission from abroad to the Teacher Training and Law programs determined by the Council of Higher Education (YÖK), a maximum of 10% of the quota for admission from abroad in these fields may be used for candidates who were born Turkish citizens but lost their Turkish citizenship by obtaining permission from the Ministry of Interior to renounce their Turkish citizenship, candidates who document that they are holders of a blue card issued to those who have lost their Turkish citizenship upon request, and candidates with dual citizenship (one of which is Turkish) and Turkish citizenship who have completed their high school education abroad (excluding the TRNC). (11) The final registration of foreign students admitted to Trabzon University is carried out by the Student Affairs Department on the specified dates. If the quotas are not filled after the completion of the final registration process (for quotas that remain unfilled, empty, or become vacant due to deregistrations);

a) Re-placement may be made from among the candidates who have not been placed in any program from the existing applications, according to the reserve list. b) The national threshold is not applied,

(12) If the quotas remain vacant after the final registrations from the reserve list, the decision on whether or not to carry out additional placement procedures is made by the University Board of Directors.

Special Aptitude Test

Article 12 - (1) Candidates applying to programs that admit students through a Special Aptitude Test must have a valid exam score from one of the exams specified in Annex Table 1 for application. (2) In order to gain the right to final registration, the principal and reserve candidates who are placed in a program requiring a special aptitude test as a result of the evaluation and placement procedures must take and pass the special aptitude test to be held on the dates specified by the University. Candidates who do not have a special aptitude test success score will not be registered at the University.

Announcement of Results

Article 13 - (1) The evaluation of results and placement results will be announced on the University's official website (www.trabzon.edu.tr) on the dates specified in the announcement.

Final Registration

Article 14 - (1) The final registration of foreign students accepted to Trabzon University is carried out by the Student Affairs Department on the dates specified below with the documents listed below. The Student Affairs Department may make changes to the registration documents listed below and may request additional documents. a) YÖS (Foreign Student Examination) results certificate,

b) Exam results certificate (Turkish translation certified by the Turkish Embassy or Consulate in their country or a notarized copy),

c) High school diploma (Turkish translation certified by the Turkish Embassy or Consulate in their country or a notarized copy),

- d) Transcript (Turkish translation certified by the Turkish Embassy or Consulate in their country or a notarized copy),
- ç) Equivalency certificate indicating completion of secondary education equivalent to Turkish high schools (equivalency process carried out by the Turkish Embassy or Consulate in their country or the Ministry of National Education),
- e) Fee-Exempt Student Passport (with endorsement) (Turkish translation certified by the Turkish Embassy or Consulate in their country),
- f) Residence Permit (Ikamet Tezkeresi) to be obtained from the Directorate of Migration Management,
- g) Two photographs (4.5x6 cm, taken within the last six months, biometric),
- h) Bank receipt indicating payment of tuition fees,
- ğ) International certificate indicating that they have the financial means to continue their higher education. Valid documents include:
 - i) A document showing the level of Turkish language proficiency (this will not be required from students graduating from high schools affiliated with the Ministry of National Education of the Republic of Turkey),
 - i) A family population (detailed) registration certificate obtained from the Population Registry Office for citizens of the Republic of Turkey or the TRNC,
 - j) For dual citizens whose first nationality is the Republic of Turkey by birth, a photocopy of the passport and a detailed population registration certificate obtained from the Population Registry Office,

(2) Candidates are required to come to the registration in person. Registration will not be done online or by mail except in extraordinary circumstances that prevent the mobility or transportation of students, such as natural disasters, epidemics, or war. Students who do not complete the registration process within the specified time or who cannot provide the necessary documents will be deemed to have waived their right to register. (3) If it is determined that those who have gained the right to register at the University with false or misleading statements and documents are present, their registration will not be made, and the registration of those who have already registered will be canceled regardless of the semester they are in. Necessary legal proceedings will be initiated against those whose actions and procedures constitute a crime.

Education and Training

Article 15 - (1) Foreign students are subject to the provisions of the Trabzon University Associate Degree and Undergraduate Education and Examination Regulations and relevant legislation regarding education and training matters.

Tuition Fee and Financial Guarantee Certificate

Article 16 - (1) Tuition fees are collected from students accepted from abroad or international students, within the minimum and maximum limits determined annually by the Council of Ministers, as determined by the University Board of Directors and approved by the Council of Higher Education. (2) Accepted students must document that they have the financial means to

continue their higher education at Trabzon University with an internationally valid official document (guarantee certificate).

Turkish Language Proficiency Levels

Article 17 - (1) The start time of studies for candidates accepted to higher education programs with Turkish as the language of instruction depends on the results of the Turkish Language Proficiency Test to be conducted by our University's TÖMER for Turkish language education. Turkish Language Proficiency levels are indicated in Table 1.

Table 1. Trabzon University Turkish Proficiency Exam levels and distribution.

2) Candidates who have achieved a C1 or C2 score on the Turkish Language Proficiency Exam (TYS) administered by Trabzon University TÖMER will begin their studies immediately.

3) Students without a Turkish Language Proficiency certificate or with Turkish language levels of A1, A2, B1, and B2 will not be able to begin their studies. These students will be granted a one-year leave of absence to receive Turkish language training in the Turkish Language Teaching program run by the Trabzon University Turkish Language Teaching Application and Research Center. During this period, students with Turkish language levels of C1 and C2 will begin their studies in the program they have been placed in. Students with insufficient Turkish language level will be given an additional year. Students who cannot document their sufficient Turkish language level at the end of the additional period will have their affiliation with the University terminated by a decision of the relevant unit's administrative board.

4) Students are required to submit their Turkish language proficiency certificates to the Student Affairs Office before the registration dates for the courses specified in the academic calendar.

5) Students who have completed their entire high school education at a Turkish high school abroad or at a high school in Turkey... Turkish Proficiency Certificate is not required.

Foreign Language Preparatory Education

Article 18 - (1) The provisions of the Trabzon University Compulsory Foreign Languages Preparatory Education Directive, which was accepted by the University Senate decision dated 16.09.2022 and numbered 58, shall apply to students who have gained the right to enroll in higher education programs where the language of instruction is a specific foreign language or a combination of Turkish and a specific foreign language.

CHAPTER THREE

Miscellaneous and Final Provisions

Health Insurance, Accommodation and Lodging

Article 19 – (1) Health expenses of foreign students are covered by the health insurance taken out by the students themselves.

(2) The student who starts his/her education for the first time as a foreign citizen student is obliged to personally apply to the Social Security Institution and have the "General Health Insurance Registration Procedures" completed within three months from the date of first registration to our University.

(3) Students who have the right to register to the university are responsible for accommodation and housing arrangements, and the university does not have any responsibility in this regard.

Obligations of Foreign Students

Article 20 - (1) Foreign students who come to Türkiye to study or are in Türkiye;

a) To carry out the necessary procedures and obtain the necessary documents in accordance with Turkish laws,

b) To notify the University's Student Affairs Department of any changes regarding personal and educational status within 15 days,

c) If they wish to extend their residence during their studies, they must obtain a new one from the provincial immigration office within 15 days of the expiry of the period stated in their residence permit, provided that they document that they are continuing their studies.

ç) If they lose their residence permit or passport, they must apply to the provincial immigration office and obtain a new one within 15 days.

d) If they change their educational institution or residence address, they are obliged to notify the provincial immigration offices of both the place they are leaving and the place they are moving to within 48 hours.

Cases Not Covered by This Directive

Article 21 - (1) In cases not covered by this directive, procedures shall be carried out in accordance with the provisions of the relevant legislation, the decisions and circulars of the Higher Education Council, and the decisions of the Trabzon University Senate.

Entry into Force

Article 22 - (1) This Directive shall enter into force on the date it is adopted by the Trabzon University Senate.

Execution

Article 23 - (1) The provisions of this Directive shall be executed by the Rector of Trabzon University.
